

Next Home Game



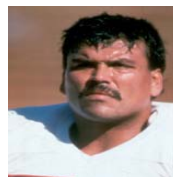

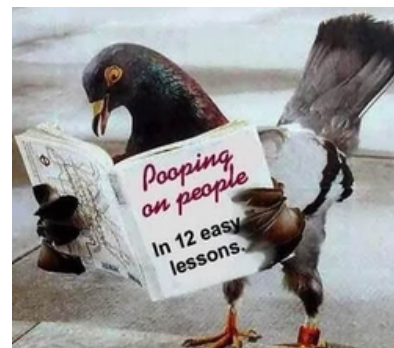


Game Day Weather

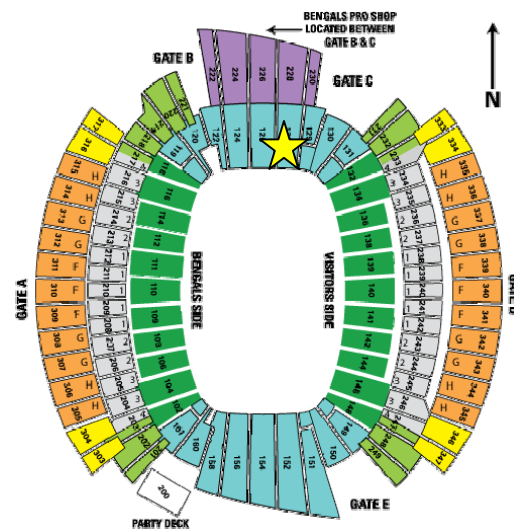
Favorite Player: Carson Palmer
